Insurance: www.askMID.com

The driver/rider will need to enter vehicle registration number and make.

Car Tax and MOT: www.gov.uk/check-vehicle-tax

The driver/rider will need to enter vehicle registration number and make.

Driving Licence: www.gov.uk/view-driving-licence

The driver/rider will need to enter their Driving Licence number, National Insurance number and Postcode. Alternately, if the Driving Licence number is unknown, the driver's/rider's name and date of birth can be used, in addition to their National Insurance number and Postcode.

In addition the driver/rider can use the above website to obtain an 8 digit case-sensitive code, which the Tutor can then use together with the last 8 digits of the Driving Licence number to check the validity of the Driving Licence.

An unofficial check of the tax and MOT status can be obtained from many FREE vehicle check sites such as https://www.caranalytics.co.uk/ or https://www.carcheck.co.uk/ (they also check bikes), this can also be useful in gaining other insights into the vehicle as they usually give things like performance information, mileage at each MOT, MOT failure and advisory notices giving an idea of how the vehicle is maintained, etc.

NOTE: do not pay to get any results, just try a different website or, often, just scroll down and the free basic information is there.
